

A PROFILE OF SILAPATHAR COLLEGE

The Silapathar College established in 1979 is located in the heart of a rapidly growing small township - Silapathar which is surrounded by villages of tribal and backward communities in the Dhemaji District of Assam.

The institution is permanently affiliated to the Dibrugarh University. It was brought under deficit system of grant-in-aid in 1992 and was subsequently provincialised in 2005 by the Government of Assam.

The college registered under 2(f) and 12(b) of UGC Act 1956 was first accredited by NAAC at the B level with institutional score of 72.00 on 28 February, 2005. It was then, subsequently re-accredited (cycle 2) with CGPA of 2.62 as B Grade on 15 November, 2015.

The college provides education for Higher Secondary and Under Graduate levels in Arts Faculty. From the session 2016-17, the college has introduced Higher Secondary course in Science Stream too.

Diploma & Post Graduate Diploma programmes in Computer Applications (DCA & PGDCA) under

Dibrugarh University, UGC sponsored Career Oriented Programme on Travel and Tourism Management,

PG programme under the Directorate of Open and Distance Learning (DODL), Dibrugarh University &

UG programme under Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) - both in distance

mode are offered in the college.

Careers 360, a reputed magazine, has listed out the best colleges located in Assam for Arts, Science and Commerce programmes with an objective to ease admission related decision making process. Silapathar College has been placed in the 33rd position among the colleges of Assam.

2. VISION

Spreading the walls of quality higher education by dissolving barriers and creating an apt environment for holistic progression of the students, academically and beyond with focus on the rich multi-cultural milieu of the land.

3. MISSION

Imparting higher education to the desiring and deserving, the unprivileged and deprived and



encouraging them to confidently remain rooted in the global knowledge society for generating competent, compassionate and charitable human resource motivated by sublime humane values.

4. THE COLLEGE EMBLEM

The uneven wheel that dominates the college emblem with black spot in it stands for unequal progress and dynamism of civilization. The burning lamp (pradip) amidst darkness (black spot) within the wheel symbolizes light of knowledge – knowledge is power — to be achieved by endeavour. The conical cap in the shape of the fore of a pipal leave on the wheel signifies the height or peak of modern civilization that has made way beyond stars.



The pipal tree also symbolizes Indian heritage of meditation for achieving knowledge. The band on which the sentence "আলোক পথৰ অভিযাত্ৰী আমি" is inscribed in Assamese meaning we are the seekers of light (knowledge) in thorny paths' is obliquely folded at the bottom as a base on which the name of the institution, চিলাপথাৰ মহাবিদ্যালয় (Silapathar College) is inscribed.

7. COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS:

English and MIL (Assamese) are compulsory for both HS and UG programmes, Alternative English may be offered in lieu of MIL and any four subjects may be chosen for combinations in case of Higher Secondary classes while any two subjects for UG classes. Students offering Major may opt for any two subjects other than the Major subject.

Note: No change in subject combination is permitted after being opted in the 1st Semester. However, there is no restriction in subject combinations.

8. THE COURSE STRUCTURE AND SCHEME OF EXAMINATIONS:

The course structure under the semester system is given as follows:

The duration of the programmes for Degree Courses is of three years. The Three Year Degree Course comprises 6 (six) semesters of which the 1st, 3rd and 5th semesters are called Odd Semesters and the 2rd, 4th and 6th semester are known as Even Semesters. There shall be two In-Semester Examinations (First Sessional and Second Sessional Examinations) in the course of each Semester before the commencement of the End Semester Examination.

Each paper will be of 100 marks of which 20 marks will be for Internal Assessment and 80% marks for End Semester Examination. Students will have to participate in the process of Internal Assessment compulsorily, failing which they will not be allowed to appear in the End-Semester Examination. The marks obtained by students in these examinations shall be notified department-wise in the departmental notice board. A student must obtain at least 24 marks (30%) in theory papers in the



End-Semester examinations and at least 6 marks (30%) in the In-Semester (Sessional) examinations to pass.

The classes of the Odd semesters (1st semester,3rd semester and 5rd semester) shall be completed by the end of October, while that of the Even semesters (2nd semester,4th semester and 6th semester) by the end of April respectively every year.

The 1st semester students will have to attend a Counselling Session on the 1st day of the commencement of classes. Further, "Students' Adalat" is held on 1st Saturday of every month to resolve students' complaints and to incorporate suggestions/recommendations. "Students' Adalat" is expected to pave equal and easy access between the students and the Principal/teachers to express openly and fearlessly their views related to academic as well as all as other matters of the college.

There shall be one End Semester Examination of three hour duration carrying 80% marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. The types of the courses and marks allotted in both General and Major Programmes may be shown as follows:

NB:In the 5th and 6th Semesters of the General Programmes, there shall be no Compulsory Course.

Instead there shall be one Skilled-Based Courses in each of the 5th and 6th Semester. The college offers "Photoshop and Web Designing" as the only Skilled-Based Course.

Dibrugarh University has approved 7 (seven) courses as Skill based Course from which students will have to opt one course as skill based course.

9. EVALUATION METHODS

Students' learning experience is evaluated from time to time in a continuous process of evaluation system through Unit Tests, Periodical Examinations in the Higher Secondary Classes and through In-Semester (Sessional) Examinations, Seminars/Group Discussion/Assignment in the BA Semester classes.

In addition to these systems of evaluation, final examinations are conducted by the AHSEC Council for Higher Secondary course and End-Semester Examinations by the Dibrugarh University for Degree Programmes.

10. INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

Internal Assessment is a method of assessing a student's punctuality, regularity and aptitude in learning process. In this method, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, group discussion etc. are employed. The procedure for Internal Assessment is prescribed below:

The 20% marks allotted for Internal Assessment in each course shall be based on:

- (i) Sessional Examination-I
- (ii) Sessional Examination-II and
- (iii) Seminar/Group/Discussion/Home Assignment etc.

Distribution of marks of Internal Assessment will be as follows:

- i) Sessional-I (written) will carry a total of 5 Marks (25%)
- ii) Sessional-II (written) will carry a total of 5 Marks (25%)
- iii) Seminar/Group Discussion/Home Assignment will carry a total of 5 Marks (25%).
- iv) Attendance 5 Marks (25%)

As per DU Guideline No. DU/DR-A/8-1/12/1552 dated 18/01/2013 Marks of Internal Assessment (20%) for attendance shall be awarded as below:

There shall be no provision for "repeat"/ "betterment" in the sessional examinations. If a student misses any sessional examination for unavoidable reasons, the student may be allowed to appear in a separate examination at the discretion of the concerned department but with a valid reason. The marks of internal assessment secured by a candidate shall be carried over to his/her next legitimate



chances. The students will be informed in advance about the nature of assessment.

Students shall compulsorily participate in tasks of Internal Assessment, failing which they will not be allowed to sit for the End-Semester Examination.

11. EXPLANATORY NOTE

a) Semester:

The word "semester" is used to mean a half-yearly programme or a half-yearly term of studies in a system of continuous evaluation.

b) In–semester:

The word "in-semester" is used to refer to the continuous studies and evaluations through the two Sessional Examinations (Sessional I & II) within the half-yearly programme.

c) End –semester:

The word "end-semester" is used to refer to the terminal processes of examinations and evaluations at the end of but within the half-yearly programme.

d) Semester Classifications:

The 1st, 3rd & 5th Semesters will be called Odd Semesters (Period: June 1– November 30), and the 2nd, 4th & 6th Semesters will be called Even Semesters (Period: December 1– May 30).

e) Skill-Based Courses:

A skill based course shall be mandatory for all students pursuing General BA Programme. The college shall offer the Skill-based Courses as per its own infrastructure and human resource feasibility.

12. ATTENDANCE

a) HS COURSE

Students attending 75% or more classes shall be allowed to appear in the examination as Regular Candidates. Students attending 60% or more classes but less than 75% shall be allowed to appear at the examination as Non-Collegiate Candidates on payment of a Non-Collegiate Fee fixed by the AHSEC. A student attending less than 60% of classes shall be declared as Dis-collegiate and will be debarred from appearing in the Annual/Final Examination. Penalty will be charged (prescribed by office from time to time) on the students who have failed to appear in the internal periodical examinations. The holding of examination and declaration of the result of the Annual Examination will be regulated by the norms of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council.

b) UNDER GRADUATE COURSE

A student should have at least 80% attendance and must obtain at least 40% marks in the In-Semester examinations to sit for the End-Semester Examination.

To be a regular candidate in the End Semester Examinations, a student must obtain 80% to 100% marks in attendance and participate in all activities performed in the process of Internal Assessment.



13. DISTANCE EDUCATION PROGRAMMES

14. CAREER AND COUNSELLING

The college has a Career and Counselling Cell to guide the students in choosing career options. It is intended to enable the students to identify promising career options and enhance interview & job skills. Raju Pegu, Assistant Professor, Department of English is the coordinator of the cell.

NSS AND SCOUT & GUIDE

An important organization of this college is NSS which renders benevolent services to society for upliftment and inculcates spirit of fellow-feeling. The college has also Scout and Guide to promote readiness among the students to extend helping hands to the victims of natural calamities. Raju Pegu, Assistant Professor, Department of English is the coordinator.

16. RED RIBBON CLUB:

Red Ribbon Club is a movement started by the Government of India in Schools and Colleges through which, students will spread awareness over HIV/AIDS. It envisages instilling charity mind among all the students to extend their able help towards developing healthy life styles, donating blood to all the needy by promotion of regular voluntary blood donation.



With an aim to create awareness on HIV/AIDS, the Assam State Aids Control Society (ASACS) has formed a number of Red Ribbon Clubs (RRCs) in the schools and colleges of the state through the National Service Scheme (NSS) as the nodal agency for RRC. Dr. Abdul Mutalib, Assistant Professor, Department of Sociology is the coordinator of Slapathar College RRC.

17. SEMINARS & WORKSHOPS

To provide a platform for exchanging scholarly views and sharing expertise among the teachers, state and national seminars and workshops are organized by the college from time to time. Through such academic exercises, teachers are expected to widen their knowledge and experience and get inspired in research. Students are also given opportunity to enhance their learning experiences through such programmes.

18. GUARDIAN FEEDBACK MECHANISM

The college has also an in-built Guardian Feedback Mechanism wherein the responsibilities of the Guardians and the institution are thoroughly discussed in the meetings held.

19. INTER-COLLEGE FACULTY EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

Silapathar College has also introduced Inter-college Faculty Exchange Programme inviting faculty members to deliver lectures on mutual basis from adjoining colleges.

20. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admission procedure in the college has been upgraded to Online System from this 2017-18 session. Students have to visit the official college website www.silapatharcollege.edu.in.wherein online admission and guidelines is displayed on the right hand corner of the home page. Students need to click and follow the steps accordingly.

However, hard copy of documents as required should be submitted to the office at the time of admission.

At the time of admission, reservation policy will be followed as per Govt. rules.

As per the direction of the Govt. there is provision for free admission (except Students' Union Fee) on submission of following documents:

- i) BPL certificate and
- ii) Evidence (photograph) of plantation of tree.

NB:

- Students having less than 40% marks in aggregate need not apply for admission. However, relaxation of 5% is provided for SC/ST students.
- Students must have H.S. (10+2) pass and obtained atleast 45% marks in aggregate and 50% marks in concern (Major) subject.
- The college authority shall have the right to reject admission to any one without assigning any reason thereof.



21. DECLARATION

A DECLARATION form will have to signed by the student as well as the Guardian at the time of admission for maintenance of strict maintain discipline either individually or in a body in the college campus. Any student found to have detrimental conduct to academic environment of the college shall attract severe punishment which may lead to expulsion from the college. (Declaration forms are attached as Annexure I & II).

22. RESERVATION OF SEATS

Reservation of seats is provided as per Govt. rules for:

- a) 2% for Sports Persons of sports recognized by IOA/SAI and a slo have represented District/State etc.
- b) 1% for wards of employees of the Colleges
- c) 1% for NCC/Scouts/Guides.
- d) 1% for the Students with achievements in cultural activities.

23. UNIFORM

Wearing of uniform in the college campus by students is mandatory. Any student found without uniform is not allowed to attend classes or transact any matter in the college office. The uniform of the college is described below:

- i) For Boys: Black trouser (long pant) and light blue shirt.
- ii) For Girls: Light blue churidar kurta with white dupatta.
- iii) For both Boys and Girls: Navy blue sweater.

24. GENERAL RULES

- i) Every student of the college must strictly maintain discipline either individually or in a body in the college campus. Any student found to have a conduct detrimental to academic environment of the college shall immediately be expelled from the college.
- ii) Every student of the college is a member of the Silapathar College Students' Union and, therefore, he/she will have to participate in any event organized by the union. The Union will have to function within the framework of its constitution.
- iii) All notices/posters/banners desired to be circulated on the notice board or elsewhere within the college campus shall require prior permission of the Principal.
- iv) The signature of the Principal on the Identity Card must be obtained within 15 days from the date of admission. The Identity Card must be kept in possession by all students in the college campus all the time.



- v) All the office bearers of the Students' Union must submit their audited accounts and allied documents/materials to the Principal at the end of academic session immediately before filling up the forms for examination.
- vi) All students including the office bearers of the Union must obtain Library Clearance Certificate from the authority concerned before filling up forms for examination.
- vii) Damage or destruction of college properties and involvement in causing disruption of normal functioning of classes is treated as punishable offence which may lead to imposition of fine along with expulsion from the college.
- viii) Indecent behaviour by students towards teachers and employees of the college will be seriously dealt with.
- ix) Use of drugs, cigar and other narcotic substances is strictly prohibited.
- x) Tearing of library books, journals, etc will lead to punishment along with due compensation.
- xi) Wearing of uniform in indecent way, bearing of informal haircut etc. are strictly prohibited.
- xii) Use of mobile phone is normally not allowed in the college campus.
- 25. STUDENTS' SUPPORT SYSTEM
- a) STUDENTS' ORGANISATION

Silapathar College Students' Union (SCSU) is the only bonafide students' organization in the college. No other students' body is allowed in the college campus. The objective of having this union body is to train the students' tolerance and democratic values by getting them involved in it. The office bearers of the union are elected annually by the students.

b) STUDENTS' ADALAT

Silapathar College aims to ensure that every student has equal access to competent and qualitative teaching which leads to vibrant academic, social and personal growth. To this end, the college has adopted a student charter wherein the students and the teachers meet on the 1st Saturday of every month to encourage the students in continuous and comprehensive learning and progression.

c) FREE STUDENTSHIP

There is also a provision of free studentship for the students who belong to any of the following categories:

Students desirous of availing the facility have to apply to the Principal with documentary evidence.

In addition to the above scholarships, the following awards, prizes and certificates are awarded to the brilliant students of this college:

- i) A Cash Prize of Rs. 10,000.00 (Ten thousand) and a Certificate of Merit to the student of this college who secures a position among the first ten successful candidates of Assam in H.S. Examination.
- ii) A Cash Prize of Rs. 5000.00 (Five thousand) and a Certificate of Merit to the H.S. student of this college securing highest marks in History in the State and to Under Graduate student securing highest marks in History Major in Dibrugarh University in the Final examination will be awarded by Dr. L.N. Pegu, Principal of this college in memory of Late Deben Pegu.
- e) STUDENTS' AID FUND
- (i) On submission of application to the Principal, an amount upto a maximum of Rs. 500.00 (Five hundred) only is granted to the poor and meritorious students holding BPL Cards.
- (ii) Under the scheme of Book Bank facility, loan of text books are given to poor and meritorious students.

26. LIBRARY

The college has a well-equipped automated library with a stock of 15166 text books, 765 references, 15 journals, 12 magazines and 6 newspapers. In addition, there is provision for free and open access to e-resource centre wherein about 1 lakh plus e-books and 3000 plus e-journals are enlisted.

The college has a fully air-conditioned 31 plus computers Language Lab with video conferencing facility. The students are given free access.

28. WOMEN'S HOSTEL

The college has a Girls' Hostel with adequate amenities. Students seeking seats in the hostel must fill in a separate Hostel Admission Form obtainable from the college office which have to be submitted within stipulated time. All boarders must abide by the following rules and regulations:

- (i) The boarders must maintain decent, dignified and disciplined principle of life in and outside the hostel.
- (ii) No visitor is allowed to meet any boarder without the permission of the hostel superintendent.
- (iii) Use of mobile phone is normally not allowed.
- (iv) All boarders must follow the mess rules in force in the hostel.
- (v) Violation of hostel rules will be seriously treated as punishable offence which may lead to expulsion from the hostel as well as the college.
- (vi) Damage of hostel property caused by any boarder will attract punishment along with charging of compensation. Depending upon the nature and reason of damage, she may be expelled from the hostel as well as the college.
